- is able to calculate the consumption of materials and the hours of work
- is able to read architectural drawings under supervision
- stakes out the main building dimensions under supervision
- transfers height marks under supervision
- uses measuring instruments
- is familiar with general principles of construction and applies them
- is familiar with building materials and their properties
- is familiar with the main construction tools and machines
- is able to strop
- is familiar with masonry technologies and is able to build walls
- lays walls with clean mortar lines
- performs simpler assembly and concrete works
- lays chimneys and smoke flues
- performs water-insulation works
- assembles and installs scaffolding and work platforms under supervision
- makes simpler formworks
- performs reinforcement work
- installs thermal insulation and insulation materials under supervision
- is persistent, emotionally stable, accurate and diligent
