A holder of the Carpainter I occupational qualification certificate:

- Is familiar with the general construction and technical data of cars and trailers
- Knows the function and working principle of car assemblies, components, systems and mechanisms
- Deals with maintenance, repair and preparation for painting of bodywork, is aware of the quality requirements for painting and finishing
- Can use catalogues and other instructive materials
- Can prepare cars for painting, knows the technologies of preparation work, painting, corrosion protection and anti-corrosion technologies and is able to use relevant equipment and devices
- Is familiar with the materials used in preparation work, painting and finishing, their quality requirements and is able to use them economically and safely
- Can establish the necessity for painting of car bodyworks or their parts
- Can estimate the volume of preparation and painting work and plan the order of tasks
- Knows the classification, labelling and characteristics of available car paints
- Can select car paint, define the proper tone and mix paints
- Can use equipment and devices available for painting, is familiar with the requirements imposed on them and is able to use
- Can perform the post-painting finishing work of cars
- Can find flaws in paint coating, knows their origin and ways to remove them
