A holder of the Mechanic/Technician level I professional certificate: - is familiar with the technologies and techniques of metal work; - is able to use and maintain garage and other equipment; - is familiar with servicing and repair systems; - is familiar with general construction, classification, general details and technical specifications of vehicle trailers; - is able to read drawings of servicing instructions and systems; - is familiar with motors, power supply, electrical and ignitions systems, transmission, automatic transmission, steering equipment and chassis, brakes, pneumatic brakes, assisted braking, traction and steering systems, safety devices, CAN/VAN computer networks, audio and navigation systems, air conditioning equipment, and immobilisers of vehicles and trailers; - is familiar with the foundations of electrical engineering; - is able to use fuels, oils, special liquids, servicing and repair materials and is familiar with their properties; - is familiar and complies with professional code of conduct and with quality standards.
