Cabinetmaker is a skilled worker who mainly works in the furniture industry and wood processing companies, manufacturing furniture made of wood and wood-based materials (for example, different cabinets, shelves, tables, etc.) and other wooden products (for example, doors, windows, stairs, etc.). The holder of a professional certificate has the following competencies: - Preparations for the treatment of wood or wood-based materials - Cutting of timber or wood-based materials on woodworking machines - Handling of wood or wood-based materials with handheld tools, including pneumatic and electric handheld tools - Manufacture of furniture and wood products - Setting up workbenches and equipment and adjusting the cutting tools - Cutting the veneer and making a veneer coating - Gluing the coating made of veneer or other materials on the base - Preparing the surface of furniture or wood product - Finishing work - Handling of finishing equipment - Repair of furniture and wood products - Installation of furniture and wooden products - Guidance and organization of the work of others
