### 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

Architects by professional qualification are able to understand and mediate the needs of individuals, social groups and authorities regarding spatial planning, architectural design, construction, conservation and valuation of architectural heritage and maintaining basic equilibria. An architect is a graduate of architectural studies from a university or a comparable educational institution. In his/her work an architect follows good planning, design and construction practices.

Diploma architect of level 7 is a specialist who prepares the architectural component and complete solutions for different types of plans and building design documentation under the supervision of a chartered architect.

Mandatory competencies:

- Preparing the architectural component of the arrangement in various types of plans

- Preparing the architectural component of building design documentation, incl. complete solution for exterior and interior space in all stages

- Working on coordination and preparation of spatial decisions of local governments and state agencies

- Management of construction and planning processes
