His/her work requires knowledge and entrepreneurship for an apiary management. A beekeeper can anticipate success and possible setback, evaluate and analyse one's activities to find necessary solutions.</p> <p>In the production process of beekeeping products the beekeeper contributes to natural reproduction, conservation of biodiversity and preservation of the environment.</p>
