<p>Forwarding timber at cuttings:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Operates the forwarder taking into account natural conditions; - Verifies the correctness and safety of the cutting area, forwarding road and timber landing, using a map and/or GPS device; - Sorts, forwards and piles up timber assortments proceeding from the production task; - Plans the stowing of timber on the timber landing proceeding from the specific nature of the timber landing, the number of timber assortments and the volume; - Estimates the volume of the load proceeding from parameters; - Maintains a register of the forwarded volumes proceeding from the volumes of the loads forwarded; - Uses sustainable operating techniques when working with the forwarder proceeding from the working environment and safety requirements; - Evaluates the quality of timber and the work results according to the work task. <p>Setting-up and maintenance of the forwarder:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Observes the good operating condition of the forwarder according to the user manual; - Sets the parameters of the forwarder right, taking into account ergonomics and the nature of work; - Determines mechanical, electrical and hydraulic faults following the user manual; - Determines the need for repair according to the user manual and where possible rectifies the faults within one's own competence; - Performs regular technical servicing according to the user manual and safety requirements; - Handles maintenance and repair waste proceeding from environmental requirements.
