3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

Woodworker of level 4 makes high-quality and aesthetic wooden handicrafts according to working drawings prepared by him/her, specified designs or simpler items, following the basic traditional or modern techniques.

He/she hews, carves, makes simpler forms, connects details (dovetails, wounds, glues), decorates, ornaments and adds finishing touches to items. He/she can perform simpler repair work of wooden items.

In addition, his/her work includes provision, preservation and processing of raw and dry timber.

A woodworker mostly uses traditional hand tools in his/her work and, if required, electrical equipment and simpler woodworking machines (sawing machines, planers, drilling machines and lathes).

He/she has acquired at least one of the following special skills: hewing, twisting natural materials, turning, bending, carving wood, intarsia and making simpler pieces of furniture from solid wood (e.g. benches, chairs, coffins).

A woodworker assumes responsibility for performance of one's tasks. He/she is ready to supervise co-workers within the limits of his/her skills.

A woodworker adheres to the ethical requirements of a master craftsperson and follows the occupational safety and environmental requirements. He/she may work in a woodworking company or as an independent undertaking. A woodworker is prepared to market his/her products, implement his/her ideas, innovate, improve and supplement existing products, communicate with customers and provide services, such as making items according to specified designs, subcontracting and supervising amateurs within the limits of his/her skills. As a result of individual development (e.g. studying in an institution of applied higher education), a woodworker may become a wood conservator, builder of wooden instruments, boat builder, basket weaver, etc.

- Preparation and use of tools
- Establishment of ergonomic and safe working environment
- Making and finishing products
- Marketing wooden products and services

- Hewing
