## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

Farmer of level 5 is a specialist with professional experience who plans, analyses, organises and assumes responsibility for livestock or plant production (both conventional as well as organic production) according to specialisation.

He/she produces, performs the first-stage processing and markets agricultural products.

His/her main tasks include planning and organising the production of the company, planning the production volumes and workforce requirements, management or performance of work, maintaining a register and report on economic activities and, if required, representing the company and communicating with customers and dealers. Working as a farmer requires working with people, as well as organising and assuming responsibility for the work of the team. He/she keeps up with the developments of his/her field of activity and is ready to implement relevant changes, if required.

Working in an agricultural manufacturing enterprise requires following the good agricultural practice and acting in a manner that ensures a safe production of food and feeding stuffs.

Farmer of level 5 who works in plant production is specialised in producing arable crops (cereals, industrial crops, etc.) and grassland management crops.

Farmer of level 5 who works in animal husbandry is specialised in breeding of at least one farm animal and/or species of poultry.

A farmer who works in mixed production may specialise in either fields or several animal or poultry species.

#### Mandatory competencies

- Management and administration

Competencies related to specialisation

- Preparation of growing area, sowing and maintenance of arable land and crops
- Harvesting, preservation and registration of arable crops (except roughage)
- Provision of roughage (silage, hay, etc.)
- Maintenance and repair of agricultural machinery (tractors, combines) and equipment (attachments, dryers, etc.)
- Taking care of animals and poultry
- Feeding animals and poultry
- Monitoring the health status of animals and poultry, perception of deviations and treatment under the supervision of a veterinarian
- Grazing animals
- Milk production
- Reproduction of cattle
- Reproduction of pigs
- Reproduction of sheep and/or goats
