<p>The work of a fire inspector is the formation of a secure and more fire safe living environment. The work of fire inspector of level 5 consists in surveillance over the enforcement of fire safety requirements, prevention of fires and other accidents, planning of actions to reduce damages that accompany accidents and ascertainment of the causes of fires.</p> <p>A fire inspector independently conducts proceedings and cooperates with other structural units, institutions and enterprises in order to raise awareness of fire safety. The position of a fire inspector requires a lot of communication.</p> <p>Competences:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Assessment of fire risks; - Conduct of administrative and misdemeanour proceeding; - Assessment of structural fire safety; - Assessment of organisational fire safety; - Usage of databases; - Preventive action; - Management and supervision.
