3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

The purpose of work of a rescuer is to perform and lead rescue work, protect the health, life, and property of people, and the environment, and operatively and professionally assist people in case of an accident.

The rescuer's work consists in performance of fire-fighting and technical rescue work and liquidation of rescue events that involve dangerous substances.

A rescuer works as a member of a team.

During the rescue work he/she obeys the orders of the rescue leader but if necessary, must take decisions independently. The rescuer uses personal protective equipment in his/her job.

Mandatory competences:

- Planning and organisation of work;
- Solution of a rescue event;
- Performance of fire-fighting;
- Performance of technical rescue work;
- Liquidation of rescue events that involve dangerous substances.

Optional competences:

- Emergency response driving.
