3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

The main task of a log house builder of level 3 is the erection of log walls from industrially manufactured components and/or modules according to prescribed instructions. He/she participates in performance of other works (e.g. installation of rafters, doors and windows, construction of load-bearing structures of floor structures and roof covering, floors and framed structures) under the supervision of a higher level log house builder.

The log house builder of level 3 works independently in some narrower line of work (e.g. storage of building materials, and other) following detailed instructions and occupational and environmental safety requirements. He/she can independently organise one's work and work in a team.

Competencies:

- Planning of work at the construction site;
- Preparation for work and organisation of work at the construction site;
- Making wooden joints;
- Erection of wooden framework walls of the log house;
- Erection of log walls;
- Construction of wooden floor structures and floors;
- Construction of roof structures;
- Installation of opening fillers (windows, doors, hatches);
- Installation of additional thermal insulation and external sidings on the log wall;
- Construction of outdoor facilities.
