## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

A junior landscape developer is a skilled worker whose main tasks are preparation of landscape development object, storage of material, earthworks, planting etc. A junior landscape developer participates in establishing a garden or green area and in construction of roads and walls. During maintenance works he/she weeds, mows, fertilizes, performs plant protection etc. He/she mainly works under supervision and in some narrower work stage independently, following detailed instructions.

A junior landscape developer works in outdoor conditions and in case of need, in public space. Working in this profession requires a good health, physical resistance and stress tolerance. He/she has a respectful attitude towards wildlife.

Mandatory competencies:

- Preparing the object (green area, facility);
- Establishing planting areas, bedding plants, incl. bulbs and sowing seeds;
- Laying pavements (concrete stone, natural stone, wood and crushed stone screenings);
- Creating lawn;
- Maintaining gardens and green areas.

Optional competencies:

- Building and maintaining wooden engineering structures (pergolas, terraces, lattice walls and simpler shelters);
- Building walls;
- Planting and maintaining indoor greenery;
- Creating garden water bodies (excl concrete swimming pools);
- Building railings.
