Whitesmiths work in enterprises that manufacture construction materials and in construction enterprises. They build proper seam roofs and corrugated sheet metal roofs and facades and install sheet metal components. Tasks include also building of a subroof, installing rainwater systems and maintaining and repairing existing roofs.

Manufacturing of sheet metal components

- Manufacturing sheet metal components in the workshop or on site
- Connecting components

Installing underlay and roof boarding on roofs and walls

- Installing underlay on roofs and walls
- Installing roof boarding on roofs and walls

- Processing of pre-seamed panes and manually seamed components
- Installing pre-seamed panes
- Installing manual rolled components
- Installing on-roof gutters
