3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES
The ceramics apprentice hand-makes quality and aesthetic items using both traditional and modern techniques and tricks of work. The ceramics apprentice knows how to retouch, burn, glaze and decorate items. The master's assistance may be needed in case of more complicated items. The apprentice follows all the safety and environmental prescriptions during all phases of work. The apprentice markets their products and provides services, such as production of items according to provided schematics and guidance of amateurs to the limit of their knowledge. A trained ceramics apprentice may, in the future, specialize to become either a mason-ceramist or a gypsum master. Parts of work: 1. Production of ceramic items - Planning - Choosing a method of production - Gathering and depositing materials - Preparing the production process - Preparation and usage of tools and equipment - Production of plaster cast - Preparation of clay mass - Stove packing items and burning - Decoration of ceramic items - Glazing of ceramic items - Retouching and packaging of ceramic items 2. Marketing of services and products - Designing their product - Forming their service - Putting their service and products on the market.
