## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

The holder of the professional certificate of Assembler I must:

- have basic knowledge of economy, legislation, occupational health and safety of working environment;
- know how to read technical documentation;
- have knowledge of the materials used in mechanical engineering and the properties thereof and know the markings thereof;
- know machinery elements;
- have knowledge of the working principles of measuring instruments and measuring devices and the usage thereof;
- have knowledge of tolerances and fits;
- know the working principles of instruments and devices of metal works and know how to use these;
- know the technology of assembling works:
- 1) measuring and marking of workpieces
- 2) preparation of blanks
- 3) bending of workpieces
- 4) processing workpieces using manual or mechanised tools or devices
- 5) cleaning and washing of workpieces
- 6) marking, drilling, threading and reaming of openings
- have basic knowledge of the formation, fine-tuning, testing, maintenance and repair of machines, aggregates, devices and metal constructions;
- know how to use and maintain assembler tools;
- know how to use lifting equipment;
- know how to do slinging works.
