3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

The main duty of the graphic prepress operator is software-based checking and processing of source material that arrived in the print-shop and preparation of printing forms. The purpose of the work is to ensure qualitatively prepared source material for printing and follow-up processing.

The profession of the graphic prepress operator is technical work that requires precision and presumes the ability to handle and maintain complex computers and equipment. The graphic prepress operator has to be willing to constantly develop and train himself/herself to manage developing software and new devices and work procedures.

The graphic prepress operator is mostly employed in print-shops, repro houses, advertising offices, marketing departments of enterprises, editorial offices and publishing houses.

- Making digital originals
