#### 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

Stage master, level 5, ensures and coordinates the safe and planned installation of the stage design, and manages the assembly and disassembly of stage decorations according to the approved stage plan. The stage manager co-ordinates the exchange and movement of the stage decorations during the performance or the rehearsal and is responsible for the proper conduct of these actions. The stage manager conducts assembly work safely, rationally and with care. Checks and supervises the preparations of stage workers before the rehearsal and performance (incl. outings). The stage master responds quickly and creatively to unexpected events happening during the performance. Ensures the most accurate reproduction and assembly of the stage design according to the situation, compiling a detailed plan in collaboration with the artist/director.

Work requires initiative, responsibility and teamwork skills. The work requires quick thinking, accuracy and technical creativity. Work requires readiness for work periods filled with stress and heavy workload to ensure that the planned production is completed in time.

The leading stage master coordinates and dynamically plans the distribution of work of the production team according to the repertoire plan and the internal rules of the organization.

It is necessary to have computer skills both in conducting the performance and in making operational changes, as well as in reading and supplementing stage plans and in adapting the outing performance to the local conditions.

The work requires knowledge of a foreign language (preferably English), in particular with regard to the stage technical specificities.

- Rebuilding of the stage design during the performance:

- maintenance of the stage block.
- 4. Preparation of the production:
- participation in technical discussions;
