#### 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

A car painter technician, level 4, restores paint surface of cars (vehicles).

The work tasks involve preparing surfaces for painting, including cleaning, filling, brushing, grinding, priming, painting and final finishing of surfaces and repair of plastic parts. The work of the car painter technician requires the use of technical guidance materials, which may be in English. The car painter technician organizes independently his/her workplace, performs tasks in normal situations and is responsible for the quality of work.

If necessary, the car painter technician, level 4, initiates, prepares and applies appropriate modifications and guides standard work of less qualified staff.

The car painter technician works both alone and in the team. The tasks include communication with co-workers.

- 1. Cleaning and maintenance of car surfaces
- Assessment of the need for vehicle cleaning
- Cleaning the vehicle's surfaces
- 2. Disassembly and assembly of the car body and interior
- Disassembly of the car body and interior
- Assembly of the car body and interior
- 3. Repair of plastic parts
- Choosing the technology for repairing plastic parts
- Repair of plastic parts
- 4. Preparation of surfaces for painting
- Planning of pre-treatment of surfaces
- Filling of surfaces
- Priming of surfaces
- 5. Painting and final finishing of surfaces
- Colour selection and testing
- Painting of surfaces
- Finishing of surfaces
