3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

A forwarder operator, level 4, is a skilled professional who performs forestry-related tasks, harvests wood and appreciates the natural environment. A forwarder operator operates a forwarder, knows its technical design and maintenance principles. The key tasks of a forwarder operator are transport of wood to the storage area for loading, stacking, assessment of assortment quality, and keeping records of wood quantity.

Forwarder operators takes into account preceding and subsequent work phases, smooth running of operations and requirements for the storage area.

Work components:

1. Maintenance and regeneration cutting
 - Operation of forestry equipment
 - Verification the accuracy of the cutting area
 - Reception and transmission of electronic data
 - Sorting, loading, hauling and stacking of wood assortment
 - Keeping records of the quantity of hauled wood
2. Adjustment and maintenance of the forwarder
 - Monitoring the technical condition of the forwarder
 - Adjustment of the forwarder's operating position
 - Defining the need for forwarder maintenance and repair
 - Handling of service and repair waste
