3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

Construction Carpenter is a skilled craftsman who works for a construction or property maintenance company or at a company that makes industrial wooden structures.

The main tasks of a construction carpenter include making and assembling wooden structural elements and construction details; building and insulating walls, ceilings and roofs made from wooden structures, often also restoring or rebuilding them; and fitting and installing interior and exterior elements (doors, windows, stairs, etc.).

Construction Carpenter, Level 4 independently manages their own workspace and is responsible for the quality of their work. Depending on the work arrangements, they can instruct and advise less experienced colleagues in their ordinary work.

Competences:

- making woodworking joints
- building and installing wooden shuttering
- building walls with wooden frameworks
- building wooden ceilings
- building roof structures
- making wooden structures industrially
- assembly work on wooden structures
- installing lining
- installing doors and windows
- building saunas
- building floors
- building other exterior structures
- renovation work
- slinging work
- energy-efficient construction
- advising and instructing less skilled construction carpenters

Optional competences:

- installing tin details on parapets and facade surfaces
- installing sloped roof coverings
- building log walls
