## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

A dance specialist is a creative worker who through teaching and/or dance creation values dance and cultural traditions at both amateur and professional levels. The job involves developing dance skills, physical awareness, self-expression and social skills.

The dance specialist, level 5 is less experienced and may require coaching.

The holder of the dance specialist, level 5 occupational qualification certificate has the skills to perform the following activities:

A.2.1 Creating a suitable environment for dance.

1. Preparing the physical environment for the activities.
2. Creating a mentally supportive environment for dance activities.

A.2.2 Managing the creative and learning process

1. Setting objectives.
2. Planning the creative and learning process.
3. Developing the participants' physical and mental abilities and dance skills.
4. Managing the creative and learning process.
5. Presenting the outcome of the creative and learning process.
6. Summarising and planning future activities.

1. Utilising basic steps and movements of folk dance.
2. Being familiar with essential repertoire.
3. Using specialist terminology.
4. Linking movement to music.
5. Assisting the director of a folk dance group.
